GIA invented the well-known 4Cs of color, clarity, cut and carat weight in the early 1950s and, in 1953, created the International Diamond Grading System that today is recognized by virtually every professional jeweler in the world.

"A lot of other places have people with certifications outside of the GIA, which makes it difficult for them to explain the 4Cs to clients," Stephanie said. "Or, they won't know about the different metals in our industry, whereas we can explain the benefits of different materials and their combinations."

On the clock and watch repair front, James Douglas Jewelers has been maintaining and repairing some of the oldest and most valuable clocks in western Pennsylvania and is one of the few, if not only, jewelry stores with its own expert clockmaker.
